OLHA MADYLUS - Cambridge University Press

Olha Madylus began her teaching career as a secondary state school in the UK teaching English and Drama. She has been involved in YLELT for over 20 years, living, teaching and training in the UK, Hong Kong, Venezuela and Greece. For the past four years she has been a freelance YL consultant and teacher trainer and is involved in the training of local state school teachers. She also does

consultation and teacher training for the British Council global teaching network. In addition to all this she is a Cambridge ESOL CELTA and CELTYL trainer. Olha is interested in the whole range of Young Learners from the age of 5 to 18, as well as all learners who are young at heart. She is particularly concerned with the role of motivation and challenge in learning. Olha contributes to publications such as English Teaching Professional and CATS, the IATEFL YL SIG newsletter. She also works with Cambridge ESOL producing seminar materials on the YLE Tests and giving presentations worldwide for teachers and parents.



SARAH ELLIS - Cambridge English Language Assessment

Is now Head of Assessment Services, Southern Europe for Cambridge English Language Assessment. She has an extensive background in teaching and teacher training in both Italy and the UK and has taught English to students of all ages and levels. She has trained teachers on CELTA and DELTA courses and has also worked with teachers in the Italian State School system. Sarah has been involved

with Cambridge English examinations for over 15 years as oral examiner, presenter and as Centre Examinations Manager. She is responsible for the Cambridge English Language Assessment teachersupport programme for Italy for which provides information, materials and support for teachers at seminars, conferences and events throughout Italy.

OLHA MADYLUS - Cambridge University Press They're not just smaller (YLE)

Many years ago it was believed that children were just small versions of adults. Today we understand that not to be true. There is a huge difference between children under 8 years old and their older counterparts. And this is particularly important to take into account when teaching them. This presentation explores these differences and how teachers can accommodate the development of the child when at the same time teaching them English. We will examine how the development of motor skills needs to be included in early literacy development; how social skills need to be fostered to create a positive learning environment; the role early cognitive developmental stages play in language learning; and the importance of imagination and creativity in children's learning. Teachers will learn to appreciate the variety of development taking place in Primary students and consider how best to make teaching appropriate to thisage group.

Developing Literacy (YLE)

Beginning reading and writing is challenging for young learners on many levels. This presentation examines those challenges and suggests strategies and activities that engage children and support literacy development. Tasks based on pre-literacy skills, whole-child learning, Multiple Intelligence theory and fun will be presented and tried out. Teachers will leave the session with lots of new ideas to use in their own lessons. Examples from Guess What and Super Minds will be presented.

SARAH ELLIS - Cambridge English Language Assessment 'The digital teacher' Making the most of digital tools & resources to develop language skills in and beyond the classroom

This session is designed to support teachers in extending their knowledge of digital tools and resources for developing their students language skills both in and out of the classroom and will include practical ideas for teachers to use for language development and exam preparation.
